Message from the President

Michelle Moxey

I was honored to have been voted in as President of the Port Stephens Cricket Club Inc. for the fifth consecutive year and it is with a degree of pride I present my final report for the 2020-21 season.

In the background a lot of work has been done by the committee and volunteer members to get the season up and running and then to maintain the momentum throughout the year. This was exacerbated by the resignation of the Secretary early in the season and the additional workload falling to a couple of our committee. This workload is often invisible and thankless, however, for myself and on behalf of all the 90 odd player members, I would like to thank each and every one of you for all your hard work. Without your efforts we would be unable to take the paddock year after year.

All this considered there have been a number of notable mentions that I would like to highlight here:

The Cricket Nets: thanks to Jordan Rimmington for his coordination, his dedication and persistence and to all the volunteers that have taken time out of their busy lives to make the upgrade possible. There is still work to be done but we are off to a great start.

Clothing: The change of Major Sponsor necessitated the redesign of our clothing range, thanks to Jarrod Moxey for the work on the design and ensuring delivery of the clothing by the beginning of the season.

King Park Master Plan: thanks to Josh Moxey for his work with the Sports Council and the Port Stephens Council on the, PSCCs and all the other sporting bodies at King Park, submission for the recommendations for the King Park Maser Plan. Thanks also to those PSCC members who submitted submissions to Council to ensure PSCC requirements were highlighted.

Transition of First XI to Newcastle Sub Districts: A big thank you to Josh Moxey for the background work and ongoing coordination to transition our First XI side from the Maitland competition to into the Newcastle competition this year. This move provided another level of administration for the committee that was predominately looked after by Josh.

A thank you to our Sponsors for their continuing support in particular; The Spinning Wheel Hotel as our major sponsor along with Curtis and Blair Real Estate, Dance Extreme, East Coast Timber and Flooring, Active Diner and Kentan, as well as our individual match day sponsors.

It has been a tough couple of seasons for the club with the advent of Covid19 restrictions for all our members and supporters. Added to this is the trying weather conditions that saw a number of washouts at the backend of this season. However, despite a number of issues and setbacks, in indomitable Python fashion the Club, for the fifth consecutive year, and the sixteenth time in the clubs 34 year history, managed to bring home the One Day Championship. Although we didn't manage to bring home the premierships this year every member should be justly proud of their contribution on this achievement.

C Grade – Managed to secure the Minor Premiership in the completion but unfortunately were unable to consolidate and went down to Lakeside Village Tavern CC in the Major Final.

B Grade – Made the final Four but were defeated in the first Semi.

A Grade – Unfortunately For the first time since the 2007/08 season A Grade failed to make the final four; this may have resulted from having a number of juniors fill in on numerous occasions through the season. Something for the club to review moving forward.

First XI – This is their first year after transition into the Newcastle Sub District competition and although they didn't dominate, as has been the case for many years in the Maitland competition they continued to carry the Pythons banner and finished the season well.

Our junior sides continued to impress, particularly the U16s who were playing up and age bracket still managed to make it to the finals only going down to Easter Suburbs in the Semi Final. Our junior players continue to push forward with a number electing to join our senior completion across various grades.

We offer our congratulations to the following players who represented the Pythons in Representative Cricket at both the junior and senior level with the following players taking Rep Caps:

First XI

Josh Moxey – John Bull Shield, Josh became the first Newcastle DCA Representative Captain in their 100+ year history, having previously represented Maitland on a number of occasions.

Jarrod Moxey – John Bull Shield, Playing under the Newcastle Banner for the first time having previously represented on numerous occasions under the Maitland Banner

Jeremy Kirk – John Bull Shield – Debuting as a John Bull Shield representative

Under 16's

Nate Blundell and Divan Bezuidenhout both represented Maitland DJCA Under 15's wining the grand final against Narrabri at Tamworth.

Nate was also selected to represent Hunter Valley Cricket Council in both the Under 15 State Carnival, and the Hunter Valley JCC Carnival.

The Pythons are recognised as one of the only clubs in clubs in the region that continue to grow at a time when cricket is struggling across the board. Much of this is due to our dedicated committee and a few volunteers who actively look for ways to progress forward and are never afraid to challenge the status quo and seek improvements for cricket not only at our club but across the region.

Our Committee have full and exciting lives, we recognise that they are busy with many competing demands. We therefore need to actively consider ways to simplify so that we spend our time and effort on what matters and we can use your help to achieve this. I want to take this opportunity to encourage our members to join the Committee. We need diversity of views and experience on how we can evolve the PSCC to meet the changing needs of the Club and its members in the years ahead. I would also like to extend a warm invitation to all members to join our Committee meetings as they are not just for Committee members. It will be a another different year of cricket due to the changes wrought by Covid 19 but I confidently look forward to another successful season by the Pythons in 2021/22. Secretaries Report

Josh Moxey - Acting

The season was always going to be a testing period for the club, firstly with the departure of the elected Secretary, Jordan Rimmington, at the beginning of the season, as well as adjusting to a return to community sport in the covid climate.

Additionally, our First XI moved into the Newcastle District Cricket Association under affiliation from Stockton and Northern Districts Cricket Club, which added a level of complexity for administrating the club that we had not dealt with before.

Our club remained the same size as previous season, with three senior sides remaining in Maitland & District Cricket Association, and a couple of junior sides also. Unfortunately, it was an indifferent season on the field, particularly due to the amount of rain and washouts that we dealt with in the back end of the year.

Firstly, our C Grade side secured the Minor Premiership, only our 6th Minor Premiership in this grade in the clubs history. Unfortunately the boys went down in an epic Grand Final to Lakeside Village Tavern CC.

B Grade, after coming fourth in the regular season was bundled out in the first Semi-Final by Bowthorne in a dissapointing end to the season.

Special mention must be made to Lachlan

Freeman, who narrowly missed out on the B Grade Player of the Year at the MDCA awards. Lachlan picked up two five-fors during the year, including 7/13 against Bowthorne in a 30 wicket season.

A Grade played the majorily of the season with fill-ins and juniors (yes, juniors) to help the remainder of the club out. It was certainly noted by the committee and the majority of the club. Unfortunately we missed the finals for the first time since 2007/08. However, both Shawn Davies and Luke Cooper had stand-out years, both finishing with 212 runs, and 22 wickets and 18 wickets respectively.

Our Under 16's played up an age division in a four team competition, finishing the year with a 3-5 record, unfortunately going down to Eastern Suburbs in the Semi-Final.

Nate Blundell and Divan Bezuidenhout both represented Maitland DJCA Under 15's wining the grand final against Narrabri at Tamworth. Nate was also selected to represent Hunter Valley Cricket Council in both the Under 15 State Carnival, and the Hunter Valley JCC Carnival.

Congratulations to both boys.

On the senior front Jeremy Kirk was selected for both NDCA's John Bull Shield side as well as the Summer Bash side, being

his first senior representative selection for the Pythons. He was joined by Jarrod Moxey and Josh Moxey who had previously represented MDCA in both competitions.

Off the field it was at times challenging, with a small committee struggling to cater for our 90 playing members in 2020-21 at times. The success of our weekly raffles was a major positive for the club, especially the help given by the non-committee members throughout the year.

Special thanks must be given to our partners for 2020-21 - firstly our Major Partner the Spinning Wheel Hotel for their owning going support of the club. Also to Curtis and Blair Real Estate, Dance Extreme, East Coast Timber and Flooring, Active Diner and Kentan, as well as our match day sponsors.

2021-22 is already shaping up as an exciting year for the Pythons, with the imminent move to Newcastle DCA and Newcastle JCA for the remainder of our club, as well celebrating our 35th anniversary.

Lastly, our club in 2020-21 secured our 16th Club Championship which is always our clubs main priority. Congratulations to all members who helped achieve this significant achievement.

I look forward to another successful season in 2021-22.

Financial Report

Please find enclosed the Financial Reports for Port Stephens Cricket Club Inc. 2020-21 Annual Report and AGM. In the last 12 months, the club received revenue of \$53,046.95 (up from \$31,273.10 from 2019-20) and incurred expenses of \$59,084.58 (up from \$26,237.68 from 2019-20) which led to a deficit of \$6,037.63 for 2020-21, with \$7,085.50 still owed to the club.

The significant increase in revenue and expenditure can be directly related to the profitability and cost of running the raffles, as well as the significant up-front clothing costs that we incur when changing a major sponsor or updating clothing for the entire club. The clothing costs are expected to be significantly less in 2021-22 and 2022-23, which will allow our club to solidify our financial position ahead of our next three year partnership cycle.

With exciting opportunities at our footstep, the outgoing, and incoming, board must remain committed to strengthening our financial position, as we look to invest in the growth of our cricket club both on and off the field.

Obituary

David "Yobbo" Robertson

18 Nov 1972 - 31 Oct 2003

David 'Yobbo' Robertson - A Phenomenal Opening batsman who was tragically taken from us, aged just 30, 15 years ago today.

Making his club debut in 2001, Yob had immediate success with the club and his impact is still being felt by those players at the club today. There are a few members of our club now that not only didn't know Yob, but also don't know of him at all. Those of you who did, please pass on the stories of this great bloke, and share a woodstock in his honour for round 4, forever known as the "Our Round 4 Yobbo"!

Yob held the record for the Highest Individual Score at the club of 175 for exactly 11 years. He scored this against Bowthorne on the 27th of October 2001 hitting 19 fours and 11 sixes along the way.

For those lucky enough to experience his unique approach to batting witnessed something no other player has matched at the club. A powerful hitter, he was always looking to score, with his trademark shot being the square drive, which he would regularly hit for six. He was the first player to score a century on King Park 5, scoring 127 against Fred Harvey in 2002. The same season, his powerful hitting would be on full display during the Grand Final, when chasing 75 to win against Hinton, he showed total disregard for the bowlers on his way to 54 not out of the 79 runs. An exceptional fielder behind the wicket, he had a safe pair of hands and would seem to throw down the stumps at will.

He is one of only 10 players for the Pythons to play Representative Cricket, and also represented the Pythons in the UK, playing for Westleigh.

Such was his impact on the club, the A Grade Players' Player award is known as the David "Yobbo" Robertson award, and his parents, Barry and Margaret, are our clubs only honorary life members, whom sadly are both know deceased.

Yob is part of the fabric that makes being a Python special, and he is proof that sometimes being a club great doesn't come merely from years of service, rather, being a quality teammate, friend, and club member for a few good years.

CONSTITUTION CHANGES – ATTACHMENT 2

(a) a reference to a function includes a reference to a power, authority and duty, and

(b) a reference to the exercise of a function includes, if the function is a duty, a reference to the performance of the duty.

(3) The provisions of the *Interpretation Act 1987* apply to and in respect of this constitution in the same manner as those provisions would so apply if this constitution were an instrument made under the Act.

2. Name

(1) The name is the Port Stephens Cricket Club Incorporated, hereinafter referred to as “the association”

(2) Teams playing in **Newcastle and District Cricket Association (NDCA) and/or Newcastle Cricket Zone (NCZ) competitions, the Newcastle Junior Cricket Association (NJCA)**, the Maitland and District Cricket Association (M&DCA), the Maitland & District Junior Cricket Association (MDJCA) and/or the Hunter Valley Cricket Council (HVCC) competitions, or any competition ran by Cricket NSW, shall be known as Port Stephens Pythons.

3. Aim

(1) The aims of the association shall be:

- To provide for participation in cricket by people from all walks of life;
- To foster an active club life by encouraging members to participate in playing and social activities and in the organisation of these events;
- To endeavour to maintain a high degree of sportsmanship;
- To develop the sporting abilities of all members of the association;
- The property and income of the association shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the aims and objects of the association and no part of that property or income may be paid or otherwise distributed, directly or indirectly, to members of the association, except in good faith in the promotion of those aims or objects.

4. Affiliation

(1) The association shall affiliate each year with **the Newcastle District Cricket Association, the Newcastle Junior Cricket Association, Newcastle Cricket Zone competitions, the** Maitland & District Cricket Association, Hunter Valley Cricket Council competitions, Maitland & District Junior Cricket Association or any Cricket NSW affiliated competition, unless otherwise voted at a suitably convened general meeting of the association.

5. Colours

(1) The association colours shall be Navy Blue, Sky Blue and Gold and be represented accurately by the following Pantone colour codes:

- Navy Blue – Pantone 282 C
- Sky Blue – Pantone 660 C
